Past President Farewell Jerry Thomas

My four years as President of the Cadet Corps Alumni Chapter have been a great experience, and with the help of Sarah, Bunky, Ray, Joel, Rex, and Jerry Houston, much has been accomplished. We have become the only alumni chapter with permanent funding, in the form of a \$19,000 Life Membership Endowment Fund. The interest on the fund provides annual monies to cover the chapter's operating expenses. Separately, we have established a Cadet Corps Endowed Scholarship Fund to provide scholarships for cadets in the future. This fund currently totals over \$22,880, and our long-term goal is to build it, year after year, until it reaches a minimum of \$250,000. UTA Alumni General Tommy Franks Returns to Campus

On May 12, 2006, General Tommy Franks was the keynote speaker at a luncheon held on the UTA campus. Many of our military alumni, as well as a number of the current Corps of Cadets were able to attend this interesting and informative lunch. General Franks talked about how important his education at UTA was, and how his fondness for our university influenced and enhanced his military career. He was introduced by CCAC past President Jerry Thomas. Quite a few members of the CCAC were present, including current president COL Ray Andrae and all of the current Board Members.

Among some of his very interesting topics was a discussion about the fact that he got his fourth star from President Bill Clinton. He also refused to jump on the bandwagon with some other retired generals who were bashing Secretary of Defense Donald Rumsfeld.

Most entertaining was his story about speaking to the entire crew of the Carrier Abraham Lincoln. About halfway through his talk on the carrier, the Captain of the ship got up from his seat and left the area. General Franks later confronted the Captain and asked why he left during the middle of the speech. The Captain explained that he needed to get a haircut. General Franks told the Captain he should have had the
