Happy New Year!! The 110th Maverick Battalion is ready to start 2013 at a sprint! **Cadet LTC Ben Carroll**, **Cadet CSM Ryan Crook**, and a new staff of senior cadets will assume control of the Battalion in early January and continue our efforts to train future officers and become a more visible organization on campus. The spring semester is shaping up to be just as phenomenal as the fFall, with 118 cadets currently enrolled in the program and 10-15 more expected to join our ranks. By the end of last semester 20 Cadets had contracted and 14 Cadets had received Army scholarships. LTC (Ret) Raymond Robert (Ray) Andrae, Sr., passed away on October 30, 2012. He will be missed.

Lieutenant Colonel (Ret) Raymond R. Andrae received a BS in Business Administration from Troy State University in 1973 and a MS in Community Agency Counseling and Guidance from Troy State in 1974. In 1975, LTC Andrae enlisted in the U.S. Army and served in the United States and in Europe in various

positions. He was in the U.S. Army Europe Honor Guard and was selected as Soldier of the Year of the 806th Engineer Battalion. In 1962, at Ft. Rucker, AL, he was appointed Warrant Officer, the youngest Adjutant General Corps Warrant Officer appointed at the time.

The next several years brought tours of service in the United States, Europe, and Vietnam. In 1976, he was assigned to the Military Science Department at the University of Texas at Arlington as Assistant Professor of Military Science.

During his years as Assistant Professor of Military Science, the first female Commander of the Corps of Cadets was appointed, the first female was commissioned from the Maverick Battalion, and Ray served as advisor to the Sam Houston Rifles Drill Team, which won the Drill Team championship in 1978.

In 1979, upon promotion to LTC, he assumed the position of Professor of Military Science and successfully managed UTA's Military Science Department until his retirement in 1981. While serving at UTA, Ray developed a deep feeling for the Corps of Cadets and the importance of the long and significant military heritage left by its members. Ray decided to have a plaque built to honor former



members of the Cadet Corps who died in combat serving their country. The plaque included not only the names of those who had fallen at the time the bronze plaque was installed, it was also designed to be able to add future names. The Hall of Honor was also started while Ray was the PMS. He presided over the first induction ceremony in 1981. The Hall of Honor is

now one of the major events for the Cadet Corps and the CCAC. Ray also started the Corps Tradition Fund for alumni who wanted to help support the Corps of Cadets. Members who joined received an engraved silver cup that the member could use during the annual Silver Cup ceremony. That tradition continues today as part of our Hall of Honor. LTC Andrae retired in 1981. That year the University of Texas at Arlington's Military Science Department was recognized as one of the outstanding programs in the state of Texas. Upon his retirement, he was appointed an Honorary Cadet Colonel in the Corps of Cadets.

In his long military career, LTC Andrae received the Legion of Merit; Air Medal; Meritorious Service Medal; Bronze Star Medal; Purple Heart; Army Commendation Medal (5 awards); Good



Conduct Medal (2 awards); and the Expert Infantryman's Badge. LTC Andrae was honored in 1993 as an Honorary Distinguished Alumni by UTA.

After his retirement, LTC Andrae served as a consultant to a number of small businesses before entering a new career in church administration. He served as Church Administrator at First Presbyterian Church in Dallas, and later at First United Methodist Church in Dallas. He was also inducted into the UTA Military Science Hall of Honor in 2001. He served as the CCAC President from 2006 to 2010.

LTC Andrae and his wife moved from Texas to Georgia in 2009 to be near his wife's family.

Ray is survived by his wife of 54 years, Patsy Hall Andrae, and sons Raymond R. Andrae, Jr. of Colleyville, Texas, and Gary Alan Andrae of Grapevine, Texas. A scholarship fund to benefit UTA Cadets has been set up in Ray's name—donations can be made through the UTA Development Office (817-272-2510).

And another CCAC Life Member and Hall of Honor Member...

LTC (Ret) Granville E. (Gene) Tyson

Our Cadet Corps alumni lost a Hall of Honor member on December 22, 2012. Chaplain Tyson was a member of ASC's championship pistol team from 1962 to 1964. After graduation he was commissioned a 2nd Lt in the Signal Corps and assigned to Ft. Gordon, GA, for the Signal Officer Basic Course. His performance was so outstanding that he never left Ft. Gordon; he stayed to become an SOBC instructor.

After active duty, he attended Perkins School of Theology at SMU for four years and was ordained an Elder in the United Methodist Church. After serving pastorates, he was appointed by the Methodist Church to be an Army Chaplain. He served in that capacity at Ft. Ord; Ft. Monmouth; Frankfurt Germany; Berchtesgaden Germany; 8th Army – Korea; and Ft. Hood, where he retired in 1996.

In 1997, he founded Tyson's Corners Retreat and Wellness Center on his horse ranch about thirty miles from Ft. Hood. From then until he succumbed to cancer, Chaplain Tyson ministered to soldiers and their families on issues associated with long separations and reintegration from combat assignments, using Equine Assisted Psychotherapy. This led to work with the Wounded Warrior Brigade, a unit made up of soldiers seriously wounded spiritually, emotionally, and physically.

For his exemplary service to his country on active duty and in retirement, LTC Tyson was inducted into the UTA Military Science Hall of Honor in 2007.

He is survived by his wife of 41 years, Judy, daughters Jennifer and Joanna, five grandchildren and brother Gerry. Donations can be made to Tyson's Corners Retreat and Wellness Center, 1135 County Road 1045, Lampasas, TX 76550.
